

Lost Dog Checklist



- ❖ Place scented items outside your home or in garage with door slightly open.
 - Dog's bed, blanket, toy, treats
 - Worn clothing from favorite person (replace daily)
- ❖ Call local police departments and humane societies (if not open, leave a message).
- ❖ Create a Facebook post(s)
 - Provide the following information in your post:
 - Dog's name
 - Closest intersection missing from & city/town
 - Describe your dog: breed, size, collar color
 - Phone number (to deter scammers, spell out some of the numbers)
 - Be sure post is set to PUBLIC so people can comment and share
 - Keep people informed by updating the top of your post(s)
Refrain from creating daily posts; it becomes difficult to stay on top of comments.
- ❖ Create a post on Nextdoor. If you don't have an account, ask someone who lives near you.

- Consider contacting a licensed drone operator – There may be a fee.

- Create bright colored road signs – We are able to assist if in or near our coverage area.
 - Place at major intersections (text large enough for drivers to see)
- Create a flyer to place on mailboxes between the flag and box – We can create flyers for you.
 - Dog's name & photo
 - Location missing from (city and intersection)
 - Describe visual identifiers: color, size, collar color
 - Emphasize DO NOT CHASE!
 - Use a phone number to be answered 24/7
 - Start flyering the area last seen and expand until a sighting comes in, then focus on that area
- Track your progress – We are able track your progress using Google Maps if you would like.
 - Create a map to document sign placement, roads that have been flyered and all sightings

During the week:

- Visit humane societies every couple days
- Follow Facebook pages of humane societies, lost and found dogs and local rescues
- Search for your dog on Petfinder (someone may be trying to rehome it)
